Clay Sculpting

These classes allow the children to create an image in their mind and actually build it with their own hands. We will teach them several techniques for shaping their ideas out of clay.

All pieces will be fired in a kiln.



Mixed Media

Mosaics

All mosaic designs are applied to frames, boxes, paper, etc. to finalize each project.
